If you ever are feeling down or discouraged, I've got some helpful advice for you, go visit David Grubbs. The man is inspirational. I visited with David for a few minutes before his sister's funeral back in June.

During the conversation, David told me a story about his parents, Robert and Annie Grubbs.

Robert worked for VDOT, and was also a carpenter and a gentleman farmer. Their farm was located in Louisa County. David's dad knew all about hard work. David said that his dad used to plow with mules and horses even into the early 1950s. Annie was a homemaker and was also no stranger to hard work. David said his mom would often help pick tobacco on the farm and she did it with joy. He said she used to carry an old harmonica in her apron. Annie would sometimes stop picking tobacco long enough to play a hymn on the harmonica, and then go right back to work.

Robert and Annie had seven children; David was the youngest. David told me that when you are a child of Robert and Annie, you grew up learning about hard work and "Golden Rule Living."

What is Golden Rule Living? David said his parents gave them several "non-negotiable" rules growing up. Among them were 1) Treat others as you want to be treated. 2) There was to be no cussing, no fussing and no loud voices in the house. 3) Absolutely no complaining or negative thinking. Robert and Annie told their children, "Listen, things aren't going to go your way all the time, life's hard, but a little hardship isn't going to shake us loose from Golden Rule Living." Despite these "rules" David remembers that their home was always filled with love, laughter and joy, even during hard times. There would be times when crops would fail, storms came or loved ones died, but they stuck together because his parents insisted they'd stick together and practice Golden Rule Living. They never waivered from this commitment and David is thankful for the way

he was raised. If you get a moment, ask David about his parents and Golden Rule living; I bet you'll come away inspired, like I was.

David's story inspired me to think about how we treat each other at Bethel. I pray that we can also practice Golden Rule Living. Let's covenant to

treat each other like we want to be treated, let's be positive thinkers and when something comes along that tries to "shake us loose," let's stick together. For I believe that Christ has put us together and has called us to do what Robert and Annie Grubbs insisted upon: To love each other. Loving each other; that's our calling and it's the essence of Golden Rule Living. Lord, thank you for Christ who taught us the Golden Rule

A Note From Your Associate Pastor and Music Minister: by Gayle Taylor



Il Corinthians 4: 7-11: But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed;



always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh.

Life is fragile and for some of us, we deal with the painful recognition of just how fragile our own bodies are. Body joints wear out, eyesight weakens, and hearing diminishes ---just to name a few examples! In the passage above, Paul compares our bodies to "clay jars"—vessels that seemingly can be broken easily.

But *what* can break us? Paul points out that for him and followers of Christ, life does not preclude the pain of affliction or of being "perplexed," "persecuted," and "struck down." Afflictions and perplexities confront us on a daily, if not hourly basis at times! Paul argues, however, that even though life's afflictions caused by people and circumstances can harm and distress Christ's followers, these outward irritants *cannot* break us to the point of being "crushed," "driven to despair," "forsaken," or "destroyed."

But *what* is it that keeps us from completely giving up and from breaking into a million pieces? "This extraordinary power that belongs to God," Paul writes, sustains us, fills us, and empowers us. Paul says that we literally carry within us the "death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus" will be seen through us, fragile vessels that we may be. We, as clay jars, are entrusted with a treasure-the treasure of the miracle of Christ dying and rising to life, appearing to his disciples, and promising to return to bring us home to live in the kingdom of God. Songwriter Darlene Zschech explores the symbol of clay vessels in the hymn, "The Potter's Hand." She reminds us that God, Our Maker, created us and holds all of our days in His hand. Not only does He create us, but as the Potter he continues to mold, to use, and to fill us. So as Christians we are hand-made clay vessels, filled with a treasure from God who continues to craft us and to protect us. As long as we live upon this earth, we have a duty and a privilege to make "visible" the good news of Christ.

We are the clay, and You are our potter; we all are the work of Your hands. Isaiah 64:8


