Christ tells us that the greatest commandments are to love God and love people. (Mark 12:30-31) Sounds great, but is there a way to know how we're doing in fulfilling these commandments? Author Philip Yancey says, "Here's a good test of how well we love: Are other people glad to be with us?" Great guestion! As you reflect on that question, allow me to introduce you to someone that I'm glad to know and be around, Amy Ingram. Amy, her husband Walt and their son Josh have been attending Bethel since early 2018. I was blessed to have worked with Amy when I worked for Central Virginia Bank a few years ago. I left the bank and lost touch with Amy until she began attending Bethel. Once Amy started attending I was really impressed with Amy's hunger for the Lord. She has a thirst to grow in the Lord, but equally as important, she wants others to come to know and experience the same peace and joy that she enjoys. I witnessed this desire one day when Amy came to me and said, "I feel like God wants me to do something, but I'm not sure what." We talked, we prayed and we explored what she thought the Lord was leading her to do. She said she thought about starting a ladies small group Bible study at C&F Bank where she is employed. We then prayed and asked the Lord to lead her in this endeavor and to show her what the ladies should study. Amy said one of the ladies at her work had the book "Emotionally Healthy Spirituality." A couple of the ladies read this book and Amy then mentioned that I had used part of that book for a sermon series not long ago and had shown the book on the

screen during
worship. The book
"The Emotionally
Healthy Woman"
came up in conversation, Amy took that
as a sign of the
Lord's leading and
then she took a step



of faith. Amy sent out the invites, but she did so with some trepidation. She had never led a class like this before so she was

nervous about leading and she wondered if anyone would even respond to the invite. Not only did eight people respond, but the Lord also provided a leader. One person who responded is actually going to be leading a small group through this book at her church in January.

There are a couple of things I'd like to take from Amy's story. First, this is exactly the kind of thing we're looking to do here at Bethel. We want to help people to listen to the Lord then we want to assist them in living out what they believe the Lord is calling them to do in their lives. One way the church assisted Amy was by purchasing the books for the class as a way of blessing them and encouraging them. Second, we've said for a long time that our desire is to minister beyond the walls of the church. Amy's small group is a great example of how to do just that. Because of Amy, Bethel now has church on Monday evenings at C&F Bank. How cool is that! There are plenty of other ways to minister "beyond the walls" of the church, the question is how is the Lord calling you to serve "beyond the walls?" How can we BE the church in our homes, workplaces and community? One other thing to note about Amy's story is notice that it involves courage and sacrifice. Amy has never done anything like this before. It took some

courage to begin the group. Then Amy and her group are willing to stay after work to grow in their faith, that's a bit of a sacrifice. Following the Lord usually requires courage and sacrifice. Here's a little secret when it comes to sacrifice: When we align our wills with the Lord's will and allow him to be Lord of our



lives, our sacrifice is the pathway to peace, joy and contentment. Amy tells me that the ladies who attend the group are blessed by their attendance and Amy has been blessed and she is truly excited for what's happening in her life as the Lord works

"Finding the Star within You"



The Wise Men were on a quest. They had noticed a unique star in the sky and knew that it was a signal of something wonderful:

Matthew 1: 1-2: In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage."

The Wise Men diligently followed the star until they located the long-awaited Christ child.

Matthew 1: 9-10 When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy.

Once they saw the Christ child, they worshipped and offered gifts:

Matthew 1: 11: On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

After the Wise Men completed their quest, they returned home:

Matthew 1: 12: And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

We do not know what happened after they returned home, but most certainly their lives changed immeasurably. People who encounter Christ become transformed and have a new approach to life. After the holidays, however, the luster of the star may dull as we move into the routine of the ordinary. Perhaps we might benefit from a renewed sense of wonder. Can we take a few tips from the Wise Men as we begin a new year?

- 1. Allow the star to lead you to seek Christ with intense passion.
- 2. Purposefully take time to worship Christ and offer your gifts and talents to serve Him.
- 3. Radiate the star's light of love in your daily travels: work, school, or community.

May you discover the unique star within yourself this New Year and "shine like stars in the world" (Philippians 2:15). Happy New Year!


