Several months ago Bethel member Kasey Myers introduced me to an organization called WomenRise. It is a great organization that is doing "Gospel Work" to help single moms. Sammie McCabe is in charge of fundraising for WomenRise, which is a program of United

Way of Greater Richmond & Petersburg. I asked Sammie to share with us what the program is all about. "WomenRise is a childcare scholarship program for single moms in school or career training. We cover the full cost of childcare, paying providers directly, so that the mom can focus on her studies and know that her child is in a safe and supportive

environment. In addition to the scholarship, we offer workshops on financial literacy, career skills and parenting – areas that our participants have all shared are of interest to them. Our goal is also to create a sense of community so that the single moms in our program can connect with each other, connect with resources, and connect with a network of women who are cheering them on."

Sammie shared one of the program's success stories with me; her name is Jasmine. "Jasmine is a first generation college student who is working toward her nursing degree because she has a passion to serve the vulnerable and one day become a Nurse Practitioner. Before WomenRise, she was having trouble balancing her 7-year-old's care while also working and taking classes. She shared with us last fall that

WomenRise 'has allowed me to focus solely on my education. I can do what I have to do and not work extra hours to afford childcare because that is taken care of.' Jasmine is a wonderful addition to our WomenRise class, and we can't wait to see where she goes.

It's women like Jasmine that remind me why I am called to do this work. There are so many single moms doing everything they can for their children and if we can just take even one burden off their plate, that can make a huge difference. Every donation, every volunteer hour, every connection is a step toward a better life for moms like Jasmine who are finding ways to rise even in the midst of so many hurdles. That's what WomenRise is all about."

WomenRise also holds a special place in Kasey's heart as well. Kasey said, "I was first introduced to WomenRise from my co-worker who had asked if I wanted to attend an event, but never did I expect to be moved like I did. The testimony of the chosen applicants left me speechless and while the program is making a difference in the mother's life, it is also making a difference in the child's life as well. My mom is a single mother and I saw first-hand the toll it can take on an individual. She was paying \$170 a week for my little brother and this was one of the cheaper daycares in town. Eventually, my mom started working part-time at the facility to cut down cost of the weekly expense. Childcare is not something a single parent should lose sleep over, but it is so common in today's world. Not everyone has the opportunity to stay home. have family members to keep the child, or even family friends that give you a great rate! WomenRise is only in its second year and they've made an impact on 6 individuals last year and with a goal of 20 this year! I am glad to have met Sammie and been exposed to an amazing program that she puts her heart and soul into each and every day! I am also glad to share this program with Bethel. WomenRise is on the rise and I am excited to see what God has in store for Sammie and her Team!"

One of our Bethel Mileposts is, "We're blessed to be a blessing." We're going to be a blessing to WomenRise on Sunday, April 24th. Join us that Sunday and you'll hear Sammie share for a few minutes about the program. Then stay after church and enjoy a BBQ lunch with us. All of the proceeds of the lunch will go directly to WomenRise. David Grubbs will be doing the cooking on that

A Note From Your Worship Pastor by Gayle Taylor



"The `Idle Tale' of Easter According to Luke" by Gayle Taylor

The blooms of daffodils and crocuses beckon to us on these warm spring days. Hyacinths perfume the air amid freshly mulched gardens. In the stores chocolate bunnies and colorful baskets await on the shelves. Easter time will soon arrive, but have we framed it as a pretty and insignificant story, an "idle tale," if you will?

In the Gospel of Luke, the writer tells us about Jesus' arrest and hearings before both Pilate and Herod. After three requests to release Barabbas and to hold Jesus accountable for crimes that he did not commit, Pilate reluctantly agrees and hands Jesus over to receive the brutal punishment of crucifixion. In Luke's account, Jesus hangs on the cross with criminals on either side of him. One criminal taunts Jesus to save them if he is indeed the Messiah. The other criminal rebukes the other and asks Jesus to remember him when he comes into his kingdom. Jesus promises that the criminal will be with him in Paradise. Darkness covers the land, the curtain in the Temple tears in half, and at three in the afternoon, Jesus dies on the cross.

After his death, Joseph of Arimathea asks Pilate for the body of Jesus. He takes the body, wraps it in linen cloths, and puts it in a tomb. The women who had been standing in the shadows during the crucifixion also witness Jesus' body being placed in the tomb. They prepare spices and ointments and return to the tomb after the Jewish Sabbath day. Instead of finding Jesus, they find a stone rolled away and two angels in dazzling clothes. These angels remind them of Jesus' prediction of his death and resurrection. The women, terrified and amazed, leave to tell the eleven disciples and other followers of Jesus about this encounter.

Upon hearing this story from Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James and the other women who followed Jesus, Luke tells us that the disciples did not believe them and considered what they said to be "an idle tale." Peter, however, rushes to the tomb himself and discovers only linen cloths inside and he, too, is amazed.

Later, that same Jesus makes appearances to the disciples, even eating with them. He sees their questioning and unbelieving eyes and says, "Why do doubts arise in your hearts?" He recounts the story of his life: the words from the prophets and the psalms and that he would suffer, die, and "rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem."

We will still offer zoom to those who can not be here. The zoom class will be from Robert Brooks class in the Providers classroom.



Humor is defined as the quality of being amusing or comedic, especially as expressed in literature or speech.

The benefits of humor:

Laughter has the potential to significantly affect the quality of our work lives. Humor helps relieve tension, reassures people, and draws us together. It likely strengthens the bonds between patients and members of their care team. It even seems to increase willingness to disclose information, so it may help with obtaining good information during patient interviews. A study of laughter therapy's effects on volunteer community care workers found that it reduced stress, anxiety, and depression.

Why not give it a try, smile, tell a joke, and make someone laugh everyday.




