Randy was born into a "prison family." His parents both worked at the Virginia Correctional

first year of his life on the grounds of the state women's prison! Randy grew up attending Fine Creek Baptist Church where my grandfather, Graham Lester, Jr was the minister. Randy later pursued a career in ministry and holds a B.A. in Religious Studies from VCU and a Masters in Divinity from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. Randy's journey led him to become the Executive Director of GraceInside. GraceInside was formed in 1920. The ministry began with one chaplain in the old Virginia State Penitentiary in Richmond and that one chaplain served just over 1,000 inmates. Today, GraceInside has 33 chaplains who serve 24,000 incarcerated men and women across all 42 state correctional facilities. During our worship service Randy will share several inspiring "God Stories," of how the Lord has worked through GraceInside ministry. Please join us for Men's Sunday.

Hallsborough Tavern Update

At the December Missions and Ministry Celebration, the members of Bethel voted overwhelmingly to enter into a Letter of Intent (LOI) to purchase Hallsborough Tavern, 2.93 acres adjacent to Bethel at 16300 Midlothian Turnpike. As discussed at



the meeting there are no current plans for the highest and best use of the property, but many believe it provides the opportunity for future growth and expansion. The purchase price is \$700,000, with \$200,000 to be paid from existing Church funds and \$500,000 to be financed.

Since that meeting the Trustees have communicated to the seller the Church's interest in pursuing a purchase and starting due diligence. An attorney has been engaged to prepare the LOI, and due diligence will include assessing structural and environmental conditions, as well as the historical designation restrictions imposed by Chesterfield County.

The Trustees will provide regular updates on the findings and progress.
