I recently rekindled my interest in Civil War history, almost by accident. In early March, Karen and I were looking for something to do on a Saturday, so we decided to hike at Appomattox. That one outing reignited my fascination with the Civil War, and since then we've visited Gettysburg, Antietam, and Sailor's Creek. Standing on those hallowed grounds, imagining the events that unfolded there, is profoundly moving. I've also been captivated by the stories of the soldiers who fought. One story, in particular, gripped me at Appomattox. Toward the end of our hike, Karen and I came across a small



cemetery with a plaque that tells the story of a man named Jesse H. Hutchins, who is buried there. Jesse joined the Confederate army five days after the bombardment of Fort Sumter and served for 1,454 days, surviving four years of carnage. Tragically, on April 8,

1865, less than 24 hours before the surrender, Private Hutchins was killed in a skirmish with Union cavalry. How heartbreaking to lose his life just hours before the war's end! As I reflect on stories like these and as we approach July 4th, words like sacrifice and freedom come to mind. The men and women of our armed forces paid an immense price to secure our freedom, giving their lives for a cause greater than themselves.

As I think about this great gift of freedom, I'm led to ask: Are we being good stewards of this gift? To what cause are we committed? Ephesians 5:15-16A encourages us to, "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity." It seems to me that the wisest way to be a good steward of our freedom is to serve Christ. The Apostle Paul captures this in Galatians 5:13, saying, "For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." This verse reminds us that our freedom is not for selfish indulgence, but for advancing God's kingdom. Or, as we've been saying at Bethel for some time now, our vision is "Knowing, Growing, and Going in the Love of Christ."

Let me share three practical ways we can live intentionally to help fulfill this mission this month. First, consider joining our "Discipling Another Program." Currently, 18 people have completed the 10-week program, and three more have just started! Our goal is to have 27 graduates this year, and we're well on our way. The material is practical, designed not only for new believers but also for "renewed believers." After completing the study, participants covenant to guide another person through the material within a year and continue discipling at least one person annually. This program fosters exponential growth, helping us build a true discipling culture as we obey Christ's command to "go and make disciples." If you'd like to be discipled, please let me know, and I'll connect you with one of our graduates. I believe you'll be blessed!

Second, get involved with our Community Engagement Team's effort to stock Crestwood Elementary's Care Closet. We're grateful for our longstanding partnership with Crestwood Elementary, and they've asked for our help to prepare their Care Closet for the upcoming school year. Through August 1, we're collecting the following items:

- 10 lunchboxes
- 1,000 pre-sharpened pencils
- 100 pairs of scissors
- 100 water bottles

Let's meet those goals and bless our good friends at Crestwood!

Finally, Jesus regularly practiced the spiritual disciplines of community and hospitality. Let's embrace these by gathering for one of our "Curtis Salyer" house parties on Wednesday, July 9. Before Curtis passed away he told me that Bethel needs to have some, "Good, old fashioned, house parties." I asked him what he meant by "House Parties" and he said we need to get together frequently with no agenda other than getting to know each other better. We'll do that on July 9 and, in keeping with the July 4th theme, we'll grill some hot dogs and hamburgers! We're asking everyone to bring their favorite summer side dish! We'll serve dinner at 6:00 PM, followed by a time of fellowship and fun.


I wanted to take a moment to thank you for the cards, food and prayers after my fall last month. Having such wonderful people around me makes a big difference in my life.

-The Liberty Bell's Annual Tapping

Each Independence Day, the Liberty Bell is gently tapped 13 times to honor the original 13 colonies, symbolizing unity and the enduring spirit of freedom.

-The Oldest 4th of July Parade

Bristol, Rhode Island, hosts the nation's oldest continuous Independence Day celebration, dating back to 1785. Founded by Rev. Henry Wight, a Revolutionary War veteran, the parade reflects the intertwining of faith and patriotism.

-The Designer of the 50-Star Flag Lived in Lancaster, Ohio

In 1958, a history teacher assigned a class assignment to redesign the national flag as both Alaska and Hawaii neared statehood. Robert G. Heft, who was 16 at the time, designed a new flag using the old 48-star flag and \$2.87 worth of blue cloth and white iron-on material. His design earned him a B-minus to which he challenged by sending it to Washington D.C. to be considered by President Dwight D. Eisenhower. According to his obituary, Heft was one of thousands to submit a flag design but he was the only person who actually stitched together a flag and shipped it to D.C. His grade was changed to an A when his flag was selected. It became the official flag in 1960.
